

Our June meeting had a very special program. In a continuing effort by the Society to record oral histories of borough residents, four sisters who grew up on West Swissvale Avenue formed a panel that was recorded and filmed.

The family moved to West Swissvale Ave in 1936. One sister still occupies the family home. Marjorie Shutterly, Marilyn Moffat, Marlene Otterman, and Marsha Hastings all contributed interesting anecdotes about West Swissvale Avenue.

It was hard to keep them on West Swissvale. In the fifties, this family traveled to parts of the world that were visited by few Americans. In one case, young Marsha was carried off to a native tent on a beach in Beirut, Lebanon.

We learned that their father Ben Otterman owned and operated a lumber mill in Edgewood and was the ultimate Rotarian. He maintained a 62-year perfect attendance record no matter where he was in the world.

The family offered support to our local Girl and Boy Scout organizations, Edgewood Presbyterian Church, and the Edgewood Club. Mr. Otterman was one of the bondholders for the first swimming pool. It was a very special evening for the Society.



Leaf Season

Before you know it leaf season will be upon us. Please review the pick-up schedule for streets (found on page 10) and see when your day is scheduled. Please note that the schedule runs from Friday - Wednesday.

If we are unable to get to a street because of weather or extenuating circumstances, we will do our very best to get back to that street the same week. If, for example, it is raining on Monday, those streets will not be picked up on Tuesday, but would be done the next Monday. We are doing our best to keep streets on the same schedule. If we move one day back we then have to

move them all back, and the pick-up days outlined become meaningless. We hope the weather will cooperate, but again we will try to get back to those streets the same week. The borough certainly appreciates your patience.

The first day of leaf pick-up will be Friday, October 14. Although signs around the borough say November 1, we are trying to be more proactive. Between the second week of October and first of November is when we get the heaviest downfall of leaves. This, coupled with the fact that we have a new leaf machine, should make pick-up more efficient this year. This schedule will be on our new web site, which should be updated by early August.






