

Activity Report


The Edgewood Police Department responded to and handled 1,942 calls for service in June 2008. There were 491 incidents reported, 347 complaints received and 16 accidents investigated, one of which resulted in personal injury, and 14 of which resulted in property damage.

Part I crimes are the more serious crimes of homicide, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny, motor vehicle theft and arson. Of the 32 Part I crimes committed in the borough, there was one robbery, one motor vehicle theft, one aggravated assault and six other crimes.

There were 21 adult and three juvenile arrests made for felony and misdemeanor violations.

Edgewood officers wrote a total of 197 traffic citations and 272 parking citations; and made three arrests for driving under the influence. There was one vandalism/criminal mischief complaint and one narcotics offense.

Officers also responded to 20 false alarm calls, took 220 reports, responded to 26 public nuisance complaints, wrote nine non-traffic citations and responded to 18 calls for medical assistance.

Borough Real Estate Tax

The Edgewood Borough Real Estate Tax is due at penalty after August 31. These are the yellow bills that went out the first of April. Not sure if it was paid? Feel free to call me at (412) 731-0200 and leave a message. I will return your call. I will not be sending out reminders in October anymore, so it is your responsibility to know if it was paid. Please remember that if you change your mortgage company or are now paying your own taxes, you must notify my office and the Allegheny County Treasures' Office.

Woodland Hills Tax

The Woodland Hills School tax bill was sent out the first week of July, just a few days late. The millage stayed the same as last year (24.65). Some of you may have noticed that your bill went down a little. This reduction is due to Act 1, the tax payer relief bill. If you did not sign up for the Homestead Act, you may be missing out. You must live in your house to be eligible.

The school tax bill is due at discount until August 31, which is a Sunday and Monday is a holiday. I will accept payments on Tuesday, September 2, but they must be in my office on that day. I have always accepted postmarks in the past, but have been told that I can no longer do that, so even if you have to put it in my mail slot on Tuesday, it will be accept-

ed. If it is received after Tuesday it will be sent back. If you have any questions please feel free to call me at my office. I hope everyone is having a great summer.

New Superintendent Appointed

He comes to us uniquely prepared to handle the challenges that confront many public school districts today. The board and I look forward to forming a partnership with Dr. Calinger to ensure that every student in our district receives the very best education possible and leaves Woodland Hills prepared to succeed in the world."


