
### WiseWalk





As of the end of July the EVFD has answered 180 calls for service. That is an average of 25 calls per month. Starting August 30th the Edgewood Volunteer Fire Department (EVFD) will be extending their services to respond to medical calls within the borough. Known as quick response service or "QRS" the fire department will be responding on only the most critical responses known as E-0 or E-1 calls along with the borough's EMS provider Eastern Area Prehospital Services (EAPS). The goals of this enhanced first responder role is to assist in providing necessary emergency medical care such as CPR, early defibrillation, control of hemorrhage and other early interventions which could make a difference when a medical crisis strikes. ### 911

The Edgewood Police respond to many 911 calls; unfortunately, it is not as many calls as we should be responding to. Time and time again, the police hear, "it wasn't an emergency, so I didn't call." Many citizens are afraid of calling 911 because they feel their situation is not a true emergency and think that they are "bothering" the police. Please understand that the police serve the community 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year. We patrol the Borough looking for potential crime while monitoring traffic. We are always available to help our residents; NO call for service is waste of our time. The male/female walking through your back yard at night may seem like nothing to you, but understand that he/she may be the person we are looking for. Without the public's assistance, the person just goes on about their business. This may be a person just walking home, or it could be connected to a bigger picture. Without your call to 911, this person goes unnoticed.

A short explanation of 911: When calling 911, there is a "call taker" who asks for vital information. They ask for a name, address and location of the town for your emergency. When calling 911, there are up to five call takers on at a time. These professionals prioritize emergency calls and will handle life-threatening calls first. If your call is not lifethreatening, and if they are busy, they will ask you to hold. No call to 911 goes unanswered—all calls are important!

Once the "call taker" gathers all information about the call, the call is sent to the Edgewood dispatcher. This process usually takes less than a few minutes depending on the complexity of the call. The dispatcher will then give the call to the police. It is not often that Edgewood Police have multiple calls at the same time, but if this occurs, we will prioritize calls and answer life-threatening calls first.

When speaking with the "call taker" you can specify if you would like to speak to an officer in person or just want them to investigate your call. You may also wish to remain anonymous, but it is helpful if you give your name and phone number in case an officer has a question.

In conclusion, all calls are important to the Edgewood Police Department. No calls will go unanswered and we hope all citizens will utilize the 911 system. The intended goal is to protect and serve the residents of our community, as well as their property.

### Car 4

Just a quick note to let everyone know that Edgewood has a new police car. A 2010 Ford Crown Victoria was received at the end of July. The new car has a state-of-the-art light bar that can be seen for miles. The car is also equipped with light at the side windows, as well as the front bumper and rear deck. You may be wondering-why so many lights? The response is officer safety. When you can see a police car from miles away, you have enough time to slow down, move over and be cautious. which makes the police safer. Please obey all the traffic laws so that you don't see our new pride and joy in vour rear view mirror!

### Edgewood Police Activity Police Statistics

The Edgewood Police Department responded to and handled 1,436 calls for service in July 2010. There were 535 incidents reported, 220 complaints received and 13 accidents investigated, 1 of which resulted in personal injury, and 12 resulted in property damage.

Part I Crimes are the more serious crimes of Homicide, Rape, Robbery, Aggravated Assault, Burglary, Larceny, Motor Vehicle Theft and Arson. Of the 21 Part I Crimes committed in the Borough, there were

Please obey the walk and don't walk lights at the intersections. Although a pedestrian has the right of way, a two-ton vehicle is unforgiving. Please use caution when crossing the street!

0 for Robbery, 0 for Motor Vehicle Theft, 2 for Burglary, 8 for Shoplifting, 1 for Aggravated Assault and 10 Other Crimes.

There were 10 adult and 0 iuvenile arrests made for Felony and Misdemeanor violations.

Edgewood officers wrote a total of 29 Traffic Citations, 257 Parking Citations and 2 arrests for Driving Under the Influence were made. There were 6 Vandalism/Criminal Mischief Complaints and 0 Narcotics Offense.

Officers also responded to 21 False Alarm Calls, took 147 reports, responded to 0 Public Nuisance Complaints, wrote 8 Non-Traffic Citations and responded to 17 calls for Medical Assistance.

## From the Manager's Desk

### Sidewalks in the Borough

Did you know the maintenance of the sidewalks in the Borough is the responsibility of the property owners? Each homeowner is responsible for maintaining the sidewalks in front of their home. As the weather turned warmer and people started to get out and walk and run throughout the Borough, we started receiving complaints about the condition of the walks. In response to these complaints our Code Department has started to inspect the condition of the walks and we are sending letters to homeowners whose walks need to be repaired. By the time you read this, some residents may have already received a notice.

Please be advised that if your problem is caused by tree roots from the trees along the street the Borough will make arrangements to have the roots cut once the damaged sidewalk is removed. We are also working with the Nine Mile Run Watershed association to explore the use of flexible paving in areas surrounding trees.

As a property owner in the Borough we are asking that you inspect your sidewalks and correct any deficiencies in your walk that may provide a hazard to people. By working together we can provide for the safety of our residents and visitors.

### Parking Pointer

When calling in overnight parking, please give the name of the resident at the address and not the visitor's name. Also, remember that you can call in multiple nights between 8:30 AM and 5:00 PM to 412-242-4824 or, prior to midnight, call them in to 412-242-9994. On the weekend, the answering service may advise you to call in each day.
