Our Very Own Field of Dreams

Edgewood resident of 23 years, Jack Grzybek, entered a contest online "on a lark" there was a possibility of baseball All Star games in his future. Once signed off he really never thought of it again, until one morning on his front porch sat a FedEx envelope. Curious as to what was inside, he jokingly told his wife, Dianne, "Oh great, we're being sued." What lie within the envelope was much better news than that.

Mr. Grzybek had entered the contest "Diamonds and Dreams Program" sponsored by Chevrolet in partnership with The Scotts Company LLC, Ripken Baseball, Ripken Design, Rawlings Sporting Goods, MLB Advanced Media and Major League Baseball®. The contest awarded 100 community youth baseball prizes across the country through the 2011 Chevrolet "Diamonds and Dreams Program." These 100 prizes included 20 field makeovers, 20 instructional clinics and 60 equipment prizes.

When the envelope was opened, it was revealed that Jack had won a trip for four to the All Star games at Chase Field in Phoenix, Arizona. Not only did he, his wife Dianne, daughter Al and granddaughter Veronica enjoy the time in Arizona, there was another prize coming to his hometown: a \$20,000 field refurbishment.

Baseball Field 1, located at the western end of Koenig Field, will receive an overhaul. The changes being made are in three categories, Field Regulation, Infield Surface and Perimeter of Playing Field.

The changes, approved by Borough Manager Warren Cecconi, are listed on page 2.



Budget Crunch Time

With the holidays also comes the 2012 Budget and the many decisions that go along with it.

Please consider joining Council, even for a brief time to voice your opinions, and learn about this very involved process. The primary budget workshop will take place on Saturday, November 12th from 8 am-1 pm. Other budget meetings will be advertised on the website and in the newspaper.

The Proposed (preliminary) 2012 Edgewood Budget will be completed sometime in November. It will be posted on the website and available at the library and Borough Building for your review and comments.



Field Regulation:

- Measuring the bases, mound, and other area for regulation
- Base distance, with regulation breakaway bases to be installed
- Removable foul poles
- Installation of a new home plate
- Batter Box grade and slope
- New pitching rubber
- Temporary mound for baseball use (due to the use of the field for other sports)

Infield Surface:

- Stability of infield mix (Soil Conditioner, Stabilizer)
- Removal of grass, weeds and foreign material from infield surface
- Grade infield
- Red infield soil conditioner installed
- Edging to back arc to Regulation
- Seeding and fertilization of outfield turf

Perimeter of Playing Field:

- Backstop and dugout mesh reattached
- Windscreen backdrop
- Fence caps
- Installation of warning track around infield, dugout to dugout
- Field access and dugout conditions improved

Edgewood DPW and members of the Board of Recreation will also receive detailed instructions for a post maintenance program and \$600.00 worth of Scott's products.

Work was scheduled to begin in late October. Once begun, the renovations should take 2 - 4 days to complete.



EVFD

At the end of September the EVFD had answered 358 calls for service in 2011. The month of September we had 38 calls for service. In between answering calls, we found time to help the Edgewood Foundation with the Oktoberfest at Koenig Field. It was a great day for grilling.

Training

Police Report

D.U.I CHECKPOINT

On Friday, September 23, 2011, Edgewood and Swissvale Police Departments conducted a D.U.I check point on South Braddock Avenue.

Officers set up the check point by placing signs and cones on S. Braddock and funneling traffic to a single lane in both directions. Three officers from each department stopped drivers, while a cover officer assisted with protecting this contact officer.

Contact officers advised the driver of the sobriety check point. They were then asked for their driver license, registration, and insurance card. While the operator obtained this information, officers checked for signs of impairment. Impairment could be indicated by blood shot eyes, slurred speech, or the odor of an alcoholic beverage.

Officers then determined if there were signs of impairment. If it was deemed that the operator of the vehicle was impaired, they were removed from the

vehicle and escorted to a holding area to perform a series of field sobriety tests.

If the operator failed the sobriety tests, their vehicle was impounded, officers obtained information for an arrest, and most drivers were then released to a sober relative. The impaired driver would then receive charges by mail.

Each driver with a vehicle registered in the borough is able to purchase a residential on-street parking pass. A visitor's pass may also be purchased. Visitor passes may not be used on any vehicle registered within the borough. The fees for these on-street parking permits as well as borough off-street lots and recreational/commercial vehicles are listed below. Permits for 2012 will be available at the Borough Building beginning December 5, 2011.

Applications for the Borough's off-street parking lots will be accepted starting on December 1, 2011.

On December 19, 2011 permits will be issued based upon requests. If more applications are received than there are available parking spaces, a lottery will be held. No resident will be issued a second permit until all initial requests are processed.

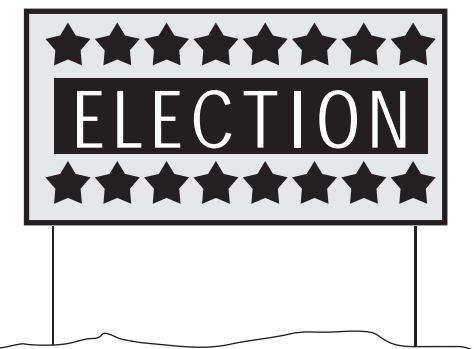
