Council Reorganizes

Edgewood Borough Council held its organization meeting on Tuesday, January 3, 2012. At that time, Judge Kim Hoots swore in J. Edward "Ed" Cook (D) as Mayor, Marc A. Wallace (D), George Fuller (R), and Patricia Schaefer (D) as 4-year term Council members. Council then elected Patricia Schaefer as Council President, George Fuller as Council Vice-President and Jennifer Gleba as President Pro Tem.

In the November election, Mr. Wallace won both the 4-year and 2-year Council seats. With his acceptance of the 4-year term, the 2-year term was declared vacant. Council appointed John Wainright to the 2-year term vacancy and he was duly sworn in by Judge Hoots.

Mayor Cook read his first Mayoral Proclamations, thanking Mayor Hellet, Councilpersons Audrey Waldock and Greg Bowers for their dedicated service to the Borough and giving each their honorary "Day" in Edgewood.

The following reappointments were made:

Other reappointments were: Greg Evashavik to the Zoning Hearing Board, Susan Lami to the Appeals Board and Mitchel Brourman to the Civil Service Commission.

The following appointments were made: Citizens Bank as the Borough Depository, Audrey Waldock as Chair of the Vacancy Board, and Dr. Michael Glass to the Planning Commission.

These certifications take over 160 hours to achieve. These accomplishments are outstanding as this is a volunteer department and all EVFD duties are done on personal time. We expect 2012 to be another banner year and have a full training schedule prepared so that we may serve you better.

2012 Parking

Just a friendly reminder, please remove your expired parking permit stickers from your rear windshield when you obtain your new sticker. Also, the Borough "lot" and "on-street parking" stickers are to be affixed to the bottom left corner of your rear windshield. Visitor pass tags must be hung from the rear-view mirror. Please avoid laying them on the dash of your vehicle. Officers may issue you a parking citation if your sticker or pass is not visible, or is placed in another location that is difficult to see.

Winter Driving

The Edgewood Police respond to many accidents in the winter months. Many of these accidents can be prevented or avoided. The following are vehicle maintenance suggestions that can help prevent winter weather accidents.

- Check your tires for tread depth and pressure. Replace tires if needed. If you cannot replace your tires place the best tires on the front of your vehicle for better steering control.
- Have your vehicle battery checked. Replace if needed.
- Check your windshield wipers and fluid. During the winter months, maintain a half a tank of gas. If you become stranded or stuck with out gas you will not have heat.



It is also important to keep an emergency bag in your vehicle. Some suggestions of items to include in the bag are:

- Blankets
- Water
- Energy bars
- Sand or cat litter (for tire traction)
- Flashlight
- · Road flares

To avoid winter weather accidents, please slow down and take your time. If the roads are snow and ice covered it is best to wait until roads are cleared before venturing out. Drive defensively and arrive alive.

American Auto Association Award

Every year the Edgewood Police Department participates in the AAA award process for Traffic and Pedestrian Safety. At the end of each year the Police Department submits an application to AAA for the award. The application must show what the Police, Fire Department and Borough have done to ensure Traffic and Pedestrian Safety. AAA will then evaluate the application and make a decision as to whether an award will be issued. There are 4 awards that the Department could receive (Bronze, Silver, Gold or Platinum). The Edgewood Police Department has received an award from AAA since 2000. The last 6 years we have received the highest award possible. (Platinum).



Mel Douglass Scholarships to Be Awarded Again

Are you a high school senior with an outstanding record of community Then you have the service? opportunity to earn a scholarship from the Mel Douglass Fund. These scholarships honor the memory of Mel Douglass, who provided exceptional leadership and volunteer service to numerous Edgewood organizations. Last year, five high school seniors from Edgewood earned scholarships for their community service achievements. The scholarships are available again this year to high school seniors living in Edgewood and planning to pursue degrees.

The 2012 Mel Douglass Scholarships will be presented in May at the annual Edgewood Foundation brunch for the Borough's graduating seniors. The primary scholarship is \$4000, paid in \$1000 installments for each year of undergraduate school. Honorable mention scholarships of \$500 are also available.

Mel Douglass grew up in Edgewood, graduated from Edgewood High School in 1970 and from the University of Pittsburgh. He married his high school sweetheart, raised two wonderful children in Edgewood and launched a successful career in business. Mel actively volunteered in multiple community service roles in Edgewood, ranging from volunteer fireman to Little League coach to church deacon, before he passed in an airplane accident in 1994. These facts only hint at Mel's true legacy, which is the wide circle of lives he enriched with his larger-thanlife personality, unquenchable spirit and commitment to serving others.

A group of his friends started these scholarships in 2008 to sustain Mel's legacy and his love for Edgewood.

Andrea Thieman won the first Mel Douglass Scholarship, followed by Anne Hazlett in 2009, Adrienne Lewis in 2010 and Ben Clifton last year. Fourteen other Edgewood students have earned honorable mention scholarships.


The board currently meets the first Thursday of every month in Edgewood, and there are typically two to three committee meetings each month.

Performances and Rehearsals Concert Season and Performance Venues: The regular concert season has traditionally been comprised of four subscription concerts: fall, holiday, late winter and spring. Repeat performances of selected concerts may be scheduled. Additional, non- subscription, concerts may be scheduled, including summer concerts. Subscription concerts are typically scheduled for Saturday




evenings at 7:30pm. The home venue for the ESO is Edgewood and surrounding communities. However, the orchestra also performs throughout the Pittsburgh area, principally the eastern suburbs. Typically, at least one regular concert per season is performed outside of the home venue.

Rehearsal Schedule:

The ESO rehearses each Tuesday evening from 7:30 to 10:00 pm. A break is held about midway through each rehearsal. The regular rehearsal venue is Woodland Hills Junior High, 7600 Evans Street in Swissvale. CCAC, Boyce Campus auditorium is used as a backup when West is not available. However, other rehearsal locations are used when required by circumstances. A warm-up rehearsal may also be scheduled, usually held immediately preceding each concert.





Tree Removal on East End **Avenue Complete**

Many trees throughout the Borough will need to be trimmed or removed over the next few years.

A total of six trees on East End Ave. were removed in late 2011 due to either severe dieback of the canopies or decay at the base.

After receiving complaints of falling branches and property damage, the Borough's arborist recommended the unsafe trees be removed. Due to power line involvement, Duquesne Light removed five trees and Arborel removed one.

An additional 38 trees were pruned to remove hazardous deadwood.

The total cost to the Borough was \$48,157.45.
