

I'm sure everyone has heard at least one commercial by now about police cracking down on unbelted drivers. Edgewood Police received grant money to assist in the education and enforcement of unbelted drivers and passengers. Over 300 police departments participated in this campaign from May 16 to June 5. The following are the results of our efforts:

- 148 Drivers were contacted by way of a traffic stop.
- 42 Drivers cited for not wearing a safety belt.
- 3 Child seat violations.
- 7 Speeding violations.
- 45 Other moving violations cited (stop signs, red signals, etc.)
- 13 Suspended drivers
- 25 Non moving violations, (Registration, inspection, no insurance etc.)
- 1 DUI arrest
- 3 Drug arrests
- 2 Warrant arrests
- 1 Other arrest, (False identification to law enforcement)

There are still many people that believe wearing a seatbelt should be a driver's option. They feel that it is their choice and that it only affects them. Although we can fill this entire newsletter with statistics and research to show that it is a necessity, PLEASE think of others. There are family, friends, co-workers that love you and may depend on you. If you choose not to wear a seatbelt, and get into an accident, your choice may have just affected more people than you think!

FPCE reaches out to youth through the FROGS program, houses the Edgewood Day Care and office of Dr. Scott Leatherberry, hosts the annual Edgewood Symphony Orchestra holiday concert and a women's choral festival, serves as the home for Boy Scout and Cub Scout Troop and Pack 23 (for

To commemorate this milestone, we're going to have a 125th Birthday Bash on Sunday, September 11, 2016 as we begin our new year of programming and activities. Enjoy singing? 
September is Library Match Month



Republic Services Collects Household Hazardous Waste and E-Waste in Edgewood

Your hazardous waste and e-waste can now be safely collected by calling this toll-free number: 1-800-464-2120

Data destruction is assured.

Look through your home for hazardous items that need to be discarded—everything from batteries and paint to computers and chemicals—and feel secure that Republic Services will safely handle these items, protecting both you and the environment.

Residents who call will be asked to describe the items to be collected. They will be told how to package their household hazardous waste (HHW) in a special HHW Kit, which will be sent to residents. (Electronics do not need to be packaged.) Each kit includes a collection date, a 42-gallon clear plastic bag, and detailed instructions on how to package the items to be collected safely and securely. Both HHW and e-waste must be kept in a secure location, NOT at the curb, until collected.

On the day of collection, Republic Services will arrive at your home to collect the HHW packaged items and/or electronics to be taken for recycling or disposal.

Acceptable HHW and e-waste (5 gallons or less):

- Paint—latex & Oil-based
- Paint thinners, Gasoline, Solvents
- Oil, Petroleum-based lubricants
- Ethylene Glycol, Antifreeze
- Pesticides, Herbicides
- Aerosols
- Mercury, Mercury Debris
- Light Bulbs—Fluorescents, Compact Fluorescents (CFL), High-Intensity
- Discharge (HID) Lamps
- Batteries—Lead Acid, Alkaline, NiCad
- Pool Chemicals
- Cleaners—Acidic & Basic
- Resins and Epoxy
- E-Waste—TVs, Computers, Monitors, VCR and DVD Players, Printers, Fax Machines, Cable Boxes, Gaming Equipment and similar electronic waste

Unacceptable HHW and e-waste:

- Radioactive Compounds
- Smoke Detectors
- Ammunition
- Explosives
- Tires
- Asbestos
- PCs (Polychlorinated Biphenyls)
- Pharmaceuticals/Controlled Substances
- Biological/Infectious Wastes
- Medical Sharps (Call or visit Republic Services online for details for methods of disposing Medical Sharps)
- Fire Extinguishers

If any of the unacceptable items are placed for collection, a large Republic Services sticker will be placed on those items, explaining why they could not be collected.

ALLEGHENY COUNTY VACANT PROPERTY RECOVERY PROGRAM 2016 SIDE YARD & BLIGHTED STRUCTURE PROGRAM

For a limited time only, Allegheny County will be accepting applications to acquire vacant properties in 45 municipalities at reduced cost to the applicant. The Allegheny County Vacant Property Recovery Program (AVPRP) acquires blighted, tax delinquent properties and resells them to applicants for a reuse outlined in their application and approved by the municipality.

PROGRAM GUIDELINES:

- This limited-time program will be available in Baldwin Borough, Bellevue, Blawnox, Braddock Hills, Brentwood, Carnegie, Collier, Crafton, Dravosburg, East Deer, East McKeesport, Edgewood, Elizabeth Township, Forward, Frazer, Green Tree, Harrison, Heidelberg, Leet, Leetsdale, Liberty, McCandless, Millvale, Moon, Munhall, Neville, North Fayette, North Versailles, Oakdale, O'Hara, Penn Hills, Plum, Ross, Scott, South Versailles, Swissvale, Turtle Creek, Versailles, West Deer, West Homestead, West Mifflin, West View, Whitaker, White Oak, and Wilkins.
- Other municipalities that join AVPRP may be eligible to participate depending upon the timing.
- Applications must be postmarked no later than **August 31, 2016**. Up to 70 applications will be accepted in the order in which they are received. No more than 5 applications will be accepted per municipality.
- Each participating municipality must submit evidence of a program marketing strategy to ensure that all residents have an equal opportunity to apply.



A note from the tax collector...

Please note: The Tax Office will be closed August 8-15, 2016. The Edgewood Borough Real Estate Tax is now due at penalty. This bill was mailed out the first of April.

The Woodland Hills School Tax was mailed out the first of July and is due at discount until August 31. If you are paying in installments, the first payment must be made by August 31. After that date you will not be eligible for the installment program. You will receive your second and third coupons in September. Please do not throw away the third coupon dated February 28 because that is the only notice you will receive. Remember to send the coupon in with your payment and no receipts will be given until the whole tax is paid.

Remember, as a homeowner it is your responsibility to make sure your taxes are paid on time.
