## From The Manager's Desk

#### Race Street Closure

Race Street will be closed though June 2024 as rehabilitation work continues on the Norfolk Southern railway retaining wall along Pennwood Avenue. The closure is in effect from 9 a.m. until 3 p.m. Monday through Friday. Pedestrian access between Edgewood Avenue and Pennwood Avenue through the pedestrian tunnel will remain open so long as the contractor can safely accommodate foot traffic. Flaggers will be stationed at the entrance as needed to control access when work may create unsafe conditions for pedestrians.

#### **Residential Building and Zoning Permits**

A zoning permit is required any time your project involves enlarging or constructing a new driveway, wall, fence, shed, balcony, deck or porch. The zoning officer will review your application and ensure its conformity with the borough's zoning ordinance. They may request supplemental information like a property survey to aid in their review. A permit will be issued once the project is reviewed for compliance with the zoning ordinance and the \$45 fee is paid.

A building permit is required any time you're making a structural change to a home. This can include removing a wall or adding a new porch or deck, repairing a deteriorating foundation, building or replacing steps (both inside and outside), or detached garage. The building inspector requires a drawing or plans along with a building permit application. A fee is collected once the plans are reviewed and approved. The fee covers the cost of reviewing the plans and follow up inspections to ensure that the project is built as designed. The permit is closed out once a final inspection is performed and that provides the property owner with proof that the project was property permitted and complies with all applicable codes.

It is important to note that a satisfactory final inspection does not evaluate the quality of the finished work (craftsmanship). Rather, it confirms the project was completed to the approved specifications and complies with the standards set forth in the Uniform Construction Code.

Just as with a zoning permit, building permits are given after plans or drawings are reviewed and the fees are paid. Building permit fees are a percentage of the total estimated cost of construction. Some projects may require an electrical permit depending on the scope of work and if there are any changes to the existing electrical layout.

Some projects require both zoning approval and building permits so it's important to contact the borough at 412-242-4824 and select option #4 to speak with the building department before starting your project.

#### Sidewalk Reminder

As spring greets us, take a moment to inspect your sidewalk for any defects and make arrangements to have it repaired. Sidewalk and curb maintenance is the responsibility of the property owner under section 177 of the Edgewood Borough Code of Ordinances.

Republic Services asks that all recyclables be empty, clean, and dry. This means that all containers must be completely free of food, grease, or liquids. When in doubt, throw it out.

Edgewood residents can recycle flattened cardboard, paper, newsprint and mail; cleaned metal and aluminum cans; cleaned #1 & #2 plastic bottles, jugs, aseptic containers and clamshells. Clamshells for produce or fruits made of #1 or #2 plastic that can be rinsed clean can be recycled. Small containers (travel sized) can be recycled but must be clean. Please discard ALL containers that cannot be rinsed clean. A dirty container can contaminate the recycling stream rendering it unrecyclable.

Republic Services has stationed a

large blue dumpster in the parking lot behind the Edgewood Borough building (2 Race Street), for items to be dropped off at residents' convenience. This bin is for GLASS COLLECTION ONLY and is located next to the paper collection bins.

All items should be placed lose in a recycling bin. Do not place any recyclables in plastic bags! Bags of recyclables will be treated as refuse and landfilled. Please keep all plastic bags out of the recycling stream.

Plastics #3-#7 are not recyclable and should be placed in the trash. Many common items made of plastic or metal including children's toys, household appliances and furnishings, and flatware should be discarded as trash. More examples include clothes hangers, plastic bags and wrappers, scrap metal and aluminum foil. These items are not re-

cyclable and clog the sorting machines.

Take out containers are not recyclable. Any container made of Styrofoam, laminated paper, or plastic, even if it's #1 or #2, contaminated with food waste should be discarded as trash. Cardboard pizza boxes are not recyclable. Drinking straws, stirs, and plastic utensils are not recyclable.

Household Hazardous Waste (paint, used motor oil, unwanted cleaning products, etc) and E-Waste collections can be scheduled for pickup by calling Republic Services customer service at 800-464-2120. Appointments for HHW and E-Waste pickups must be scheduled; these items will not be collected with residential collection.




#### **ESO's Final Concert of the Season**

#### **Koenig Field Reservations**

Groups or individuals engaged in an organized (i.e. leagues, social clubs, amateur associations, etc) sporting activity are required to apply for and receive a field use permit. Individuals or groups wanting dedicated tennis or pickleball court time are encouraged to reserve their desired space to ensure access. Establishing a field use permit system ensures that field space is available for both groups and individuals to maximize recreational opportunities while ensuring equity amongst all users.

Scheduling preference will be given to Edgewood residents and then to other leagues, groups, clubs and associations. All facilities are open to the public unless otherwise reserved for organized use. The public may use all other parts of Koenig Field at any time that are not reserved for organized play.

A fee schedule has been created, in order to best manage regular upkeep and maintenance on borough facilities. Fees may be waived by Edgewood Borough Council on a case-by-case basis. Refunds will be given at the discretion of the borough in instances of bad weather where playing during or immediately after could damage the field, or if the borough unilaterally cancels a reservation.




