From The Manager's Desk

Selling your home? Here's your checklist:

Anyone selling property in Edgewood must complete a few simple tasks to facilitate the sale. Sellers are generally required to conduct a dye test to make sure their downspouts and sump pumps are not connected to the sanitary sewer system. Any plumber licensed by the Allegheny County Health Department can perform this test, you do not have to use one recommended by a real estate agent and the borough does not stipulate which company does the testing. The certification form is available on the borough's website under the administration tab. Your plumber must complete the form and return it to the borough along with the \$40 processing fee.

The next required item is requesting a municipal lien letter. This letter is generated by the borough and certifies that there are no outstanding municipal claims or liens against the property for unpaid items like trash or sewage. This item is usually requested by the closing company once a property is under contract. There is a \$45 fee for this service and that is typically paid for by the closing company. A sale cannot be finalized without a lien letter.

The last item required to close is a certificate of occupancy. Upon request by either the seller or the closing company, the borough will conduct an occupancy inspection during which time the inspector checks to see that the property has the required number of functioning smoke and CO2 detectors, that there are GFCI outlets installed near areas of water, and that other general health and safety items are functioning properly.

An occupancy inspection is not a home inspection, it merely ensures that property meets all requirements under the building code to occupy overnight. Residential occupancy inspections cost \$50 and that includes one follow-up reinspection. It is strongly recommended that you schedule an occupancy inspection as soon as you accept the buyers offer to avoid any closing delays as can happen if the inspection uncovers a problem that requires hiring a contractor to correct.

The Certificate of Occupancy form is available on the borough's website under the Administration tab. The form and payment must be submitted to the borough before the inspection will be scheduled. Please contact the borough's code enforcement and zoning officer, Ralph Sinnamond to schedule. He can be reached via email at <code>inspections@edgewoodboro.com</code> or by dialing 412-242-4824 x 219.

A note about residential rental properties:

Residential rental properties including bed and breakfasts and short-term rentals (i.e. Air BnB's) are subject to occupancy inspections once every three years. Inspection arrangements must be made through the borough's code enforcement and zoning officer.

Long Run Fitness Studio

e spoke with Amanda Verrengia, Owner/Operator/Trainer of Long Run Fitness Studio. Ms. Verrengia, who lives in the neighborhood with her husband and three children, was working as a personal trainer until, like so many businesses, she ad to move her sessions online in 2020. After a

had to move her sessions online in 2020. After a year and a half of being virtual, she decided to reassess her business goals. At that time, while out on a run, she saw a 'for sale' sign for 123 Edgewood Ave. She knew that the time was right to open a studio where trainers could meet with clients, as well as to have space for group fitness classes. Edgewood was the prime location, where people could come together locally to meet their fitness goals.



The studio is a shared space where trainers each run their own business, using the space to train their clients during their own set hours. Offerings at Long Run Fitness Studio include 1:1 personal training, group exercise classes, and, most recently, a free, community run group every Tuesday at 6PM. The ages and fitness levels of starting clients vary widely and training programs are tailored to their individual needs. Ms. Verrengia said that she's in "awe of every person who shows up, because that's the most challenging part. Deciding to show up for yourself is the greatest thing you can do." Ms. Verrengia specialize in women's fitness, run training/strength training for runners, and pre- and postnatal fitness. She mostly takes clients 1:1, but she does teach a 45-minute group circuit class every Friday at 9 AM (all levels welcome!) "I absolutely love what I do. Each of my clients trusts me with this hour of their lives a few times

a week, and I feel lucky that I get to be a part of how they show up for themselves and work towards their current goals."

When we asked what she likes best about being in Edgewood and what she hopes to see for the future of the neighborhood, Ms. Verrengia responded that, "Edgewood is such a wonderful, walkable neighborhood—so many people walk by the studio each day! I'd love to see more small businesses on Edgewood Avenue. The new coffee shop is going to be a great post-workout stop for our clients, and we'd love to see more businesses find their home along our street!"

Parkway Interchange Landscape Maintenance


Volunteers Wanted!

The Western Pennsylvania Conservancy maintains the Edgewood Parkway Interchange site. Volunteers are needed to help with this effort. This takes place every Wednesday and Saturday, weather permitting, starting May 15, 2024 and going through mid-September. Work includes weeding, deadheading flowers, and removing litter. The start time is 9 a.m. and should last about 1 1/2 hrs.



Koenig Field Reservations

Groups or individuals engaged in an organized (i.e. leagues, social clubs, amateur associations, etc) sporting activity are required to apply for and receive a field use permit. Individuals or groups wanting dedicated tennis or pickleball court time are encouraged to reserve their desired space to ensure access. Establishing a field use permit system ensures that field space is available for both groups and individuals to maximize recreational opportunities while ensuring equity amongst all users.

Scheduling preference will be given to Edgewood residents and then to other leagues, groups, clubs and associations. All facilities are open to the public unless otherwise reserved for organized use. The public may use all other parts of Koenig Field at any time that are not reserved for organized play.

A fee schedule has been created, in order to best manage regular upkeep and maintenance on borough facilities. Fees may be waived by Edgewood Borough Council on a case-by-case basis. Refunds will be given at the discretion of the borough in instances of bad weather where playing during or immediately after could damage the field, or if the borough unilaterally cancels a reservation.


