Two Days of Community Day Approved; Twice the Fun August 19 & 20

At their May 1 meeting, Edgewood Borough Council approved a plan to make Community Day a two-day event for 2006. This happened through the collective efforts of Borough Council's Community Services Committee, the Borough Manager, and the Edgewood Foundation.

Day one will remain basically the same - the 5K run and walk will start at 8:30, followed by the traditional parade and activities on the field, leading up to the evening concert and fireworks. The day-two festivities are scheduled to begin at 2 p.m. on August 20, and run until roughly 9 p.m. From 2 p.m. on, families are encouraged to bring a picnic lunch and convene under the main tent. Entertainment will be on site all afternoon, and the evening will culminate in the season's final installment of Movie Night. Should there be rain on August 19, the second day will act as the rain date for Fireworks.

The Edgewood Boy Scouts will provide assistance throughout the day, as will Edgewood Foundation volunteers, Borough Council and recreation employees.

NMRWA to Evaluate Rain Barrel Initiative this Summer

The Nine Mile Run Watershed Association will continue with the Rain Barrel Initiative this summer by looking at how the 500+ barrels installed in our watershed are being operated. If you have a barrel, expect to hear from us - we'd like your input and we're eager to answer any questions you may have.

Engineering studies project that 4000 barrels will have a measurable

impact on stormwater runoff into Nine Mile Run. So we have set an ambitious goal of installing 3500 more rain barrels in the watershed to achieve this positive impact on the stream. We will not be installing barrels during the spring or summer of 2006. The earliest we would start installing more barrels is this fall.


