New AEDs



The PULSE Program is designed to give AEDs to organizations that might not be able to afford the purchase of these expensive machines. With the new models, everyone — including infants less than one year of age - will be able to be treated. The Edgewood Police Department has in its possession approximately ten recovered bikes which were accumulated during this year. Activity Report

The Edgewood Police Department responded to and handled 2,127 calls for service in July 2007. There were 699 incidents reported, 274 complaints received and 12 accidents investigated, two of which resulted in personal injury, while the remaining ten resulted in property damage.


Part I Crimes are the more serious crimes of homicide, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny, motor vehicle theft and arson. Of the 25 Part I Crimes committed in the borough, one was burglary, 14 were shoplifting, and 11 were other crimes.

There were 12 adult and seven juvenile arrests made for Felony and Misdemeanor violations.

Edgewood officers wrote a total of 89 traffic citations and119 parking citations and made two arrests for driving under the influence. There were four vandalism/criminal mischief complaints and one narcotics offense.
