BOROUGH OF EDGEWOOD MINUTES OF THE COUNCIL MEETING OF JUNE 17, 2013

President Schaefer called the meeting of the Borough of Edgewood to order at 7:35 pm in the Municipal Building.

ROLL CALL

Upon roll call, the following responded: Mr. Bright, Mr. Wainright, Mr. Wilson, Ms. Gleba, Mr. Fuller and Ms. Schaefer.

Solicitor Barry and the Junior Councilperson were also present.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

ITEMS FROM THE FLOOR

Robin Price - The Edgewood Foundation

Ms. Price said the Edgewood Foundation held its Senior Brunch for graduating high school seniors, and was able to give all seven seniors college scholarships. She also said the Foundation was preparing for Community Day.

George Pettrone - 113 Harlow Street

Mr. Pettrone is Kate Luckett's attorney, who resides at 136 W. Swissvale Ave., and he spoke on her behalf about a zoning hearing board decision.

Ms. Gleba moved to authorize the payment of bills, for goods and services received by the Borough, having been reviewed and approved by the General Government Committee, from the General Fund, in the amount of \$35,026.63 and from the Sewer Fund in the amount of \$98,780.84 for a total of \$133,807.47. Second by Mr. Wilson.

GENERAL GOVERNMENT Ms. Gleba asked for suggestions from Council on articles for the newsletter, and said real estate tax money was being collected, but would fall below the budgeted number due to reassessment appeals still taking place.

POLICE REPORT President Schaefer had no report.

PUBLIC SAFETY Mr. Fuller said the Committee met to discuss a proposal by the owners of Edgewood Towne Centre to install security cameras instead of paying for extra police patrols. A discussion on the topic followed.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT The Committee did not meet.

PUBLIC WORKS President Schaefer said 3 Rivers Wet Weather circulated a draft storm water management ordinance that the Committee should review.

COMMUNITY SERVICE Mr. Wainright said the Committee met to discuss a resident's request that Edgewood be placed on the National Registry of Historic Places.

PERSONNEL Mr. Fuller said the Committee did not meet.

PENSION Mr. Bright said the Committee did not meet.

AD HOC COMMITTEES

3 RIVERS WET WEATHER DEMONSTRATION PROJECT/CONNECT President Schaefer said CONNECT's annual congress will take place in November.

SOLICITOR'S REPORT Solicitor Barry said a new attorney who is handling the McDonald's deal had told him that the Phase II environmental study was still being reviewed.

BOROUGH MANAGER'S REPORT Manager Cecconi said the first phase of sewer repairs was complete, and that he was communicating with the Port Authority about improvements to the bus shelters on Edgewood Ave.

COMMITTEE ACTION

Ms. Gleba moved to pay off the tax anticipation loan in the amount of \$352,922.20 effective June 18, 2013. Second by Mr. Wilson.

DISCUSSION: Ms. Gleba said the Borough was paying off the loan early, and in doing so will save the \$3,377.80 in interest payments.

Mr. Wilson moved to reject the one bid for the borough building window replacement project, per the M-5 architect's recommendation, and to re-bid the project. Second by Ms. Gleba.
