BOROUGH OF EDGEWOOD MINUTES OF THE COUNCIL MEETING OFDECEMBER 19, 2016

President Schaefer called the meeting of the Borough of Edgewood to order at 7:30 pm in the Municipal Building.

ROLL CALL

Upon roll call, the following responded: Mr. Bright, Mr. Wainright, Mr. Wilson, Mr. Fuller and Ms. Schaefer.

Mayor Cook and Solicitor Barry were also present.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

ITEMS FROM THE FLOOR

Allen Alexander -1127 Savannah Avenue

Mr. Alexander spoke on behalf of the board of the Regent Square Civic Association. He asked that letters be set to residents who do not shovel their sidewalks after a snow or ice event.

Paul Heckbert -104 Washington Street

Mr. Heckbert started a petition on change.org to have a crosswalk installed at Sanders Street and S. Braddock Avenue intersection. He read comments that the petition had received. Ms. Schaefer said that the petition stated the Borough planned to ban pedestrian crossing at Sanders, which was not accurate. She also said that Council had received the comments, but had not received the actual petition. A discussion followed.

Fran Escalante - 907 N. Negley Avenue

Mr. Escalante thanked Council for applying for the TAP grant. He stated that people want to cross at Sanders, and will cross no matter what signage is put in place. Mr. Escalante said he believes that a safe crosswalk design could be installed to enable a crossing at this location, and hoped for the opportunity for community input. Ms. Schaefer explained the traffic study and data collection process, and said that the results of the study would be discussed at public meetings.

Tim Madle -1223 S. Braddock Avenue

Mr. Madle said that he uses the crosswalk at Charleston to cross S. Braddock Avenue, and said he finds this a very difficult place to cross the road. He said the crosswalk is faded and that cars do not stop for pedestrians in the crosswalk. He also said the visibility at this location is poor. Ms. Bastianini said that upgrading this crosswalk was part of the TAP project.

M-1 Mr. Wainright moved to approve the minutes of November 21, 2016. Second by Mr. Fuller.

PENSION Mr. Bright said the committee met with representatives from Oakmont Capital to discuss the investment policy statement.

SOLICITOR'S REPORT Mr. Barry had a report for executive session.

BOROUGH MANAGER'S REPORT Ms. Bastianini updated Council on the public works department's winter weather preparation. She said the Borough's 2016 financial audit would begin on January 17th. She updated Council on the progress of the sanitary sewer repair project. She said the Borough's holiday party would be on Friday, December 23rd.

NEW BUSINESS Mayor Cook lifted the parking ban beginning at 3:00 am on December 24th, and to be reinstated at 5:00 am on January 3rd.

M-5 Mr. Wainright read the following resolution:
